Chapter 138.

An Act to provide for the remuneration of Deputy Sheriffs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The remuneration of deputy sheriffs while in attendance upon supreme judicial courts in the several counties, and while in attendance on any court where jury trials may be held, shall receive for said attendance three dollars per day for such attendance. The fees provided by section sixty-nine of chapter twenty-nine of the revised statutes shall remain as heretofore established.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 139.

An Act relating to attendance of Witnesses at court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one hundred and fifteen of chapter eighty-four of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "not exceeding twenty" in the fifth line and inserting in place thereof the words 'not exceeding one hundred.' So that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 115, chapter 84, R. S., amended.

'Section 1. When a person, summoned, and obliged to attend before any judiciary tribunal, fails to do so without reasonable excuse, he is liable to the party aggrieved for all damages sustained thereby. The judge or justice of such tribunal may issue a *capias* to apprehend and bring such delinquent before him; and he may be fined not exceeding one hundred dollars and costs of attachment, and committed until the same and costs are paid.'

Witnesses summoned, neglecting to attend, in contempt and are liable for damages.
