CHAPT 170**Chapter 170.**

An Act to amend Section ninety-five of Chapter forty-nine of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter one hundred twenty-one of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, relating to notice of injury to Casualty Insurance Companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 95, chapter 49, R. S., as amended by chapter 121, public laws, 1905, amended.

Time within which notice of accident, injury or death may be given, fixed at not less than thirty days.

Section 1. Section ninety-five of chapter forty-nine of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred twenty-one of the public laws of nineteen hundred and five, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

'Section 95. No conditions, stipulations or agreements contained in any application for insurance in any foreign or domestic casualty or accident insurance company, or contained in any policy issued by any such company, or in any way made by any such company, limiting the time within which notice of the accident or injury, or death, shall be given to such company to a period of less than thirty days after the happening of the accident, or injury, or death, shall be valid. Said notice may be given to the company insuring, at any time within thirty days after the happening of the accident, or injury, or death and shall be valid and binding on the company.'

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 171.

An Act to establish the salary of State Superintendent of Schools and further define his duties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Salary of state superintendent of schools.

—official duties.

Section 1. The salary of the state superintendent of schools is hereby established at twenty-five hundred dollars per annum. He shall receive in addition his actual cash expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties which sum shall be paid out of the specific appropriation for that purpose. He shall perform his official duties at the office provided for him at the seat of government and not elsewhere, not meaning, however, to prohibit him from making such necessary journeys and performing such duties as are necessary or incidental to the immediate object of such journey.

Section 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
