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**Chapter 4.**

An Act additional to and amendatory of Chapter two hundred and thirteen, Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, entitled "An Act to incorporate the York Light and Heat Company."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Authorized to issue bonds.

Section 1. The York Light and Heat Company is hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds for the payment of or refunding its indebtedness, and for the further construction and improvement of its works and plant, and for such an amount and at such rate and time as it may deem expedient and necessary, not to exceed the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars in addition to the amount of its present bonded indebtedness, and may secure the same by a mortgage or deed of trust upon the franchise or franchises, property or estate owned by or to be hereafter acquired by said corporation, but said mortgage shall not diminish the security of the bonds heretofore issued by said corporation remaining unpaid.

—not to exceed \$250,000 in addition to present bonded debt.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 5.**

An Act to extend the charter of the South Portland Trust Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Charter extended.

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the South Portland Trust Company, which was granted by chapter four hundred eighty-seven, of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, and extended by chapter eighty of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, for a period of two years, and extended by chapter forty-eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five, be further extended for the future period of two years from the approval of this act; and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
