bate and insolvency, officers and treasurers of towns, cities, counties, and savings banks of the state of Maine may deposit any moneys, bonds, stocks, evidences of debt or of ownership in property, or any personal property, with said corporation, and any of said courts may direct any person deriving authority from them to so deposit the same.

First meeting, how called. Section 10. Any three of the corporators named in this act may call the first meeting of the corporation by mailing a written notice, signed by all, postage paid, to each of the other corporators, seven days at least before the day of the meeting, naming the time, place and purpose of such meeting, and at such meeting the necessary officers may be chosen, by-laws adopted, and any other corporate business transacted.

Section II. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 28.

An Act to extend the charter of the Matagamon Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chanter extended.

Section r. The rights, powers and privileges of the Matagamon Manufacturing Company which were granted by chapter two hundred seventy-nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred one and by chapter forty-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred three and by chapter ninety-nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred five are hereby extended, and the persons named in said act, their associates, successors and assigns, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said acts, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said acts.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
