CHAP. 38

Chapter 38.

An Act to regulate fishing in that part of Sebago Lake known as Songo River, also in Crooked River in the County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Fishing in certain part of Sebago Lake, regulated.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any fish of any kind in that part of Sebago lake known as and called Songo river, from the point opposite of what is now known as Oliver's camp, a place in said lake known as the mouth of Songo river, to Songo lock, so called, from September first of each year to June first of the following year. Provided, however, that it shall be lawful to dip smelts and suckers in the usual way.

Fishing in Crooked River regulated.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any fish of any kind in Crooked river, so called, from September first of each year to June first of the following year. Provided, however, that it shall be lawful to dip smelts and suckers in the usual way.

—proviso.

Penalty for violation.

Section 3. Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine of ten dollars for each offense, and one dollar additional for each fish taken, caught or killed in violation hereof.

Proviso.

Section 4. Provided, further, that this act shall not take effect until the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, without expense to the state, have caused notices to be posted in conspicuous places at or near the waters herein described setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.

Chapter 39.

An Act to extend the charter of the Searsport Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Charter extended.

All the rights, powers and privileges of the Searsport Trust Company which were granted by chapter two hundred and seventy-nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five, are hereby extended for two years from the approval of this act.
