PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

1907.

Harbor Head, so called, in said Tremont; thence across Bluehill bay and across the islands in said bay, or forming the southerly boundary thereof, to a convenient point in Swan's island in said county; also from any point in the town of Brooklin, Hancock county, Maine, to Naskeag Point in said Brooklin; thence across Jericho bay, so called, and the islands in said bay, or forming the easterly boundary thereof, to a convenient point in said Swan's island; thence to any point or points therein; said lines to be land lines or cable, as may be appropriate; and the right to maintain an exchange and telephone system throughout all parts of said Swan's island.'

—may maintain exchanges and telephone system.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 42.

An Act to amend section one of Chapter fifty-three of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three, in relation to fishing in Bagaduce River.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter fifty-three of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three is hereby amended by substituting in the last line of said section the word 'December' for the word "February" so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 1, chapter 53, private and special laws, 1903, amended.

'Section 1. It shall be unlawful to take or fish for eels in any manner whatever in the Bagaduce river, Bagaduce bay or any of the tributaries of said river or bay between the fifteenth day of April and the first day of December of each year.'

Eels, close time in Bagaduce river.

Chapter 43.

An Act to extend the charter of the Waldo Street Railway Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The time within which the Waldo Street Railway Company shall actually commence business, under its existing charter, is hereby extended to two years from the approval hereof.

Charter extended.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
