Chapter 46.

An Act to authorize the Portland Wharf and Land Company to erect and maintain a wharf into the tide waters of Casco Bay in the city of South Portland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Portland Wharf and Land Co. authorized to build wharf into tide waters.

Section 1. The Portland Wharf and Land Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the state of Maine, its successors and assigns, as the owners of certain real estate in the city of South Portland, on Cushing's point, so called, are hereby authorized to construct and maintain a private wharf, pier and breakwater from said point into the tide waters of Casco bay, not exceeding three hundred feet beyond low water mark.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 47.

An Act to repeal Chapter four hundred and three of the Private and Special Laws of Maine, nineteen hundred and three, entitled "An Enabling Act for the annexation of the City of South Portland to Portland."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter 403, private and special laws, 1903, repealed.

Section 1. Chapter four hundred and three of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, entitled "An Enabling Act for the annexation of the City of South Portland to Portland," is hereby repealed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
