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CHAP. 65  
 Proviso.

Section 5. Provided, further, that this act shall not take effect until the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, without expense to the state, shall have caused notices to be posted in conspicuous places at or near said pond, setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.

### Chapter 65.

An Act to authorize the Great Northern Paper Company to own and operate mills in any county in the state and to hold stock in the Northern Maine Power Packet Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Great  
 Northern  
 Paper Co.,  
 authorized  
 to operate  
 mills in any  
 part of state.

Section 1. The Great Northern Paper Company, in addition to the rights, powers and privileges which it now possesses, is hereby authorized and empowered to build, acquire, own, maintain and operate mills for manufacturing purposes in any county and all counties in the state, also to purchase and hold shares of the capital stock of the Northern Maine Power Packet Company or any other similar corporation, with all the rights and privileges of a stockholder in such corporation.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 66.

An Act to amend the charter of the North Branch Dam Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 2,  
 chapter 424,  
 private and  
 special laws,

 amended.

Section 1. Section two of chapter four hundred twenty-four of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, entitled "An Act to incorporate the North Branch Dam Company" is hereby amended by inserting between the word "seventeen" and the word "and" in the ninth line of said section two the words 'township five, range seventeen,' also by inserting between the word "nineteen" and the word "west" in the fourteenth line of said section two, the following words 'also on, in and along Dole brook so called and all tributaries thereof and all streams to which it is tributary within the limits of township four, range eighteen, west of the east line of the state, township three, range five, North Bingham's Kennebec Pur-

chase, township four, range five, North Bingham's Kennebec Purchase, township five, range twenty, west of the east line of the state,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 2. Said company is hereby authorized to erect and maintain dams, side dams, piers and booms, on, in and along the Saint John's stream, so called, and all tributaries thereof, and all streams to which it is a tributary within the limits of townships five and six, range seventeen, west of the east line of the state, also, on, in and along the northwest branch, so called, of the Penobscot river, and all tributaries thereof and all streams to which it is tributary within the limits of township six, range seventeen, township five, range seventeen, and township five, range eighteen, west of the east line of the state, also in, on and along Norris brook, so called, and all tributaries thereof and all streams to which it is tributary within the limits of township five, range eighteen, and township five, range nineteen, west of the east line of the state, also on, in and along Dole brook, so called, and all tributaries thereof, and all streams to which it is tributary within the limits of township four, range eighteen west of the east line of the state, township three, range five north of Bingham's Kennebec Purchase, township four, range five north of Bingham's Kennebec Purchase, township five, range twenty, west of the east line of the state, also to remove rocks and excavate ledges therefrom, and to widen, deepen, and otherwise improve said stream, for the purpose of making said stream floatable, and facilitate the driving of logs, lumber and wood down the same, to construct and maintain carriers and sluices from said Saint John's stream within the limits of township six, range seventeen, to said northwest branch of the Penobscot river, provided that the water of said Saint John's stream shall not thereby at any time be diverted or reduced from its natural flow.'
