**Chapter 74.**

An Act additional to Chapter four hundred and twenty of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, entitled "An Act to incorporate the New Portland and Eustis Telephone and Telegraph Company."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Said chapter four hundred and twenty of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine is hereby amended, by adding the following paragraph to section one of said act:

amended.

'Said corporation shall also have the right to locate, construct, maintain and operate lines of telephone and telegraph from some point in said town of Anson, through Madison, to some point or points in Skowhegan in said Somerset county.'

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 75.**

An Act to extend the charter of the Lily Water Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Lily Water Company which were granted by chapter one hundred and two of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, and extended by chapter one hundred and seventy-four of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five for and during the period of two years from the eighth day of March, nineteen hundred and five, are hereby extended for two years from the approval of this act; and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said act.

Charter  
extended.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
