**Chapter 80.**

An Act to extend the charter of Sanford Trust Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Sanford Trust Company, which were granted by chapter four hundred and sixty-nine of the private and special laws of one thousand nine hundred and one, as amended by chapter one hundred and fifty-three of the private and special laws of one thousand nine hundred and five, are hereby extended for two years from the approval of this act and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner, and for the same purposes as specified in said act.

Charter

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 81.**

An Act to regulate fishing in Big Lyford Pond, in the County of Piscataquis.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time during the regular open season in Big Lyford pond, in the county of Piscataquis, except in the ordinary method of angling with artificial flies or fly fishing.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation hereof.

Section 3. Provided, further, that this act shall not take effect until the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, without expense to the state, have caused notices to be posted in conspicuous places at or near the waters herein described setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.
