Chapter 91.

An Act to amend Chapter five hundred eighty-eight of the Private and Special Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one entitled "An Act to incorporate the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Good Templars of Maine."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The title of said act is hereby amended by striking out the word "Independent" and inserting in place thereof the word 'International,' so that the title of said act shall read as follows:

Title amended.

"An Act to incorporate the Grand Lodge of the International Order of Good Templars of Maine."

Section 2. Section one of chapter five hundred eighty-eight of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred seventy-one is hereby amended by striking out the word "Independent" in the sixth line of said section and inserting in place thereof the word 'International,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 1, chapter 588, private and special laws, 1871, amended.

'Section 1. Joshua Nye, Smith Baker, Jr., B. F. Hamilton, Sumner Basford, Henry N. Shorey, W. L. Hathorn and their associates and successors, be and are hereby incorporated a body politic by the name of the Grand Lodge of the International Order of Good Templars of Maine, with power to sue and be sued, to have a common seal, to make any by-laws for the management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of this state, and shall have such powers and privileges and be subject to such duties as are provided for similar corporations; may elect such officers as may be deemed necessary for the management of the corporation, and may hold, sell and convey property, real and personal, to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars.'

Section 3. The constitution and by-laws of the grand and subordinate lodges, Independent Order of Good Templars of Maine, as approved by the committee on constitutions of said Grand Lodge of Maine, October eleven, nineteen hundred and six, are hereby ratified and approved as the constitution and by-laws of the Grand and Subordinate Lodges International Order of Good Templars of Maine.

Constitution ratified.

Section 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
