CHAP. 113**Chapter 113.**

An Act to prohibit the deposit of certain waste substances in the waters of the west branch of the Mattawamkeag Stream or its tributaries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Deposit of mill waste in Mattawamkeag stream, prohibited.

—exception.

Section 1. All persons, firms, associations or corporations are hereby prohibited from depositing waste substances from sawmills or tanneries in the waters of the west branch of the Mattawamkeag stream or its tributaries, with the exception of waste waters or liquors from tanneries, and such portion of waste solid matters from tanneries as cannot reasonably be prevented from going into said waters by the process of screening.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 114.

An Act to amend Chapter two hundred and seventy-seven of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three, amending "An Act to establish a Municipal Court for the town of Brunswick."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 8, chapter 277, private and special laws, 1903, amended.

Recorder, appointment of.

—tenure.

—powers of recorder.

—salary.

Section 1. Section eight of chapter two hundred and seventy-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

'Section 8. The governor, by and with the consent of the council, shall appoint a recorder of said court, who shall reside in said Brunswick, and hold his office for the term of four years. In case of the absence of the judge from the court room, or when said judge shall be an interested party, or when the office of judge shall be vacant, the recorder shall have and exercise all the powers of the judge, including the authority to sign original writs and processes. He shall receive an annual salary of one hundred and fifty dollars in full for all services, payable quarterly on the last days of March, June, September and December, from the treasury of Cumberland county.'

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
