Chapter 157.

An Act to amend Chapter one hundred and fifty-four of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-five as amended by Chapter twenty of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred five, relating to the charter of the Wiscasset Water Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section nine of chapter one hundred fifty-four of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred ninety-five as amended by chapter twenty of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred five is hereby amended as follows: the word "ten" in the first line of said section as amended is stricken out and the word 'fourteen' inserted, so that the section shall read as follows:

'Section nine of this act shall become null and void in fourteen years from the approval thereof unless the corporation shall have organized and commenced actual construction of its works under this charter.'

Section 2. Said chapter one hundred fifty-four of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five is hereby revised, as above amended.

Chapter 158.

An Act to extend the charter of the Pepperell Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Pepperell Trust Company, which were granted by chapter fifty-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred three, and extended and amended by chapter two hundred eighty-one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred five, are hereby extended for two years from the approval of this act, and the persons named in said act and their associates and successors have all the rights, powers and privileges that are granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purpose as specified in said act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
