Chapter 165.

An Act to amend Section one of Chapter five hundred thirty-eight of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, relating to the taking of Smelts in Sheepscot River.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter five hundred thirty-eight of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine is hereby amended by striking out from said section the words "Wiscasset toll bridge," and inserting the following in place thereof:

'A line from Thorpe island in Boothbay in a southwesterly direction to Low point in Georgetown on a line drawn across all tide waters from shore to shore from Thorpe island to Low point and all coves on said line between said points,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. No person shall fish for smelts in the Sheepscot river, or its tributaries between a line from Thorpe island in Boothbay, in a southwesterly direction to Low point in Georgetown, on a line drawn across all tide waters from shore to shore from Thorpe island to Low point and all coves on said line between said points and head of tide in Alna, except by hook and line.'

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 166.

An Act to regulate fishing in Round and Long Ponds and their tributaries in Livermore.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish through the ice in Round or Long ponds, in the town of Livermore, county of Androscoggin, for a period of six years.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries of said Round or Long ponds, which ponds are situated in the town of Livermore, county of Androscoggin.

Fishing in
tributaries
of Round or
Long ponds,
prohibited.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful to take, catch, kill or have in possession any trout less than eight inches in length or any landlocked salmon less than twelve inches in length taken from either of these ponds.
