CHAP. 174**Chapter 174.**

An Act to regulate fishing in East Carry Pond in the County of Somerset.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Fishing in
East Carry
pond,
regulated.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch or kill with bait and hook more than twenty-five trout in one day in East Carry pond, in the county of Somerset; it shall also be unlawful for any person to take, catch or kill with artificial flies or fly fishing more than twenty-five trout in one day in said pond; it shall also be unlawful for any person, to take, catch and carry away more than fifteen pounds of trout in one day taken from said pond.

Penalty for
violation of
this act.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation hereof.

Proviso.

Section 3. Provided, further, that this act shall not take effect until the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, without expense to the state, have caused notices to be posted in conspicuous places at or near the waters herein described setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.

Chapter 175.

An Act to regulate fishing in Swan Lake and its tributaries, in the towns of Searsport, Swanville and Frankfort, in the County of Waldo.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Swan lake,
to regulate
fishing in.

It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish except smelts on or through the ice in Swan lake, situated in the towns of Swanville, Frankfort and Searsport, in the county of Waldo, or to take, catch or kill at any time any trout less than ten inches in length, or any salmon less than fourteen inches in length taken from said Swan lake, or from any of its tributaries, under the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing.
