Chapter 178.

An Act to amend the charter of the Caribou Water, Light and Power Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. The Caribou Water, Light and Power Company is hereby authorized and empowered to erect and maintain such booms and piers as may be necessary and effectual for the holding of logs, railroad sleepers and other lumber in Aroostook river in the part thereof constituting the pond made by its existing dam betwixt said dam and the mouth of Hall brook, so called. Said piers and booms shall be built and maintained so as not to interfere with the reasonable and suitable passage through said pond of logs, lumber, rafts and boats.

Section 2. No other piers or booms shall be erected in said pond without the consent of the legislature. The said company, its successors, assigns and licensees shall have the exclusive right and privilege of driving, sorting and holding logs within the enclosure of said booms and piers.

Section 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 179.

An Act to change the name of Widow's Island,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The name of Widow's island, located in the Fox islands thoroughfare, Penobscot bay, is hereby changed and shall hereafter be known and designated as Chase island.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
