Penalty for violation of this act.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in violation of the provisions hereof.

Chapter 192.

An Act to extend the powers and rights of the Brunswick Electric Light and Power Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Organization made valid.

The organization under the general law of the Section 1. Brunswick Electric Light and Power Company, and all acts of said company thereunder, are hereby ratified, confirmed and

Authorized to furnish electricity within certain counties.

made valid. Section 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized and empow-

-to supply electricity railroads.

ered, subject otherwise to the general law relating thereto, to manufacture, transmit, distribute and furnish electricity for light, heat and power, within the counties of Cumberland, Sagadahoc and Androscoggin, and to erect and maintain pole lines, power stations, machinery and other necessary equipment therein; and to sell and supply electricity for any of said purposes to any railroad or street railroad, person or corporation, or to any town, city or district within said territory, which said railroads, street railroads, persons, corporations, towns, cities and districts are hereby respectively authorized and empowered to contract with said corporation therefor. Provided, however, that, excepting the right to transmit electricity by trunk lines through any part of said territory to any other part thereof in which it legally may have or acquire the right to distribute and sell the same, and excepting the right to sell and distribute electricity in Cumberland county for power purposes only, nothing herein contained shall authorize said corporation to engage in business in any part of said territory in competition with any other corporation legally doing, or authorized to do, a similar business therein, without the consent of such other corporation.

May combine with other companies.

Section 3. Said corporation and any other corporation organized for similar purposes and doing business in said territory are hereby respectively authorized and empowered to combine their properties, rights, privileges and franchises, by sale or lease, or otherwise not contrary to law, and the company so purchasing or otherwise acquiring the plant, property, business, rights, privileges, franchises and capital stock of the other shall have full right and power to hold, exercise and operate the same.

Section 4. Said corporation for the purposes of its organization or for the purposes authorized by this act is hereby authorized and empowered to issue its bonds to an amount not exceeding its then capital stock and to secure the same by a mortgage or pledge of any and all the real and personal estate and rights, privileges and franchises, then owned, held or possessed or thereafter to be owned, held or possessed by it.

Section 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 193.

An Act to extend the powers of the Canaan Power Company,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The Canaan Power Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the state of Maine, in addition to the powers enumerated in its charter is hereby authorized to make, generate, sell, distribute and supply electricity for lighting, heating, manufacturing and mechanical purposes in the town of Canaan in the county of Somerset, and in as much of the town of Fairfield in said county as lies north of a certain line running westerly from the Kennebec river beginning at a point one-half mile south of Shawmut village and extending to the Smithfield line; also, so much of the town of Clinton in the county of Kennebec as lies within one mile of the east bank of the Kennebec river.

Section 2. Said corporation is further authorized to construct and maintain a dam with the right of flowage in the Carrabassett stream at a point near the location of the Ricker privilege, so called, and to acquire by purchase or otherwise any and all other water powers, privileges and property incident thereto on said stream, and to construct and maintain dams thereon. But nothing herein shall be construed as granting to said company the right to flow existing privileges not acquired, or take any water power by right of eminent domain.

Section 3. Said corporation is hereby authorized to con-

struct and maintain dams at the foot of Oak pond, Long pond, Sibley pond and Morrill pond for the purposes of storing water therein, and the damages for flowage caused by such dams may
