Chapter 198.

An Act relating to the records of instruments affecting or conveying title to real estate in the county of Waldo and now recorded in other counties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Upon the approval of this act the governor shall appoint and commission some suitable person, who after first being sworn to perform his duty under this act, shall at once proceed to cause to be copied so much of the records now in the registry of deeds for the county of Hancock, as relate to real estate in that portion of the present county of Waldo which was formerly included in said county of Hancock prior to the organization of said county of Waldo, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty-seven.

Section 2. The copies shall be made on paper of the kind and quality used for recording deeds in the registry of deeds for said county of Waldo and shall be bound into books corresponding in size and quality with those now in use in said office, and shall be indexed in the form known as ledger index, corresponding with that now used in said office.

Section 3. The copies shall be compared by the commissioner, who shall certify to their correctness. When so certified and deposited in the registry of deeds for the said county of Waldo, they may be used for any purpose the same as the original record.

Section 4. Said commissioner shall purchase all supplies and employ such clerical help as may be needed to advantageously forward said work and shall be accorded by the registers of deeds for the several counties reasonable facilities for the execution of the work without trouble or expense to them.

Section 5. Said commissioner shall receive compensation for his personal services at a rate to be fixed by the governor. He shall submit an itemized statement showing the amount due him on account of his personal services, amount paid for clerical help, paper, binding or other necessary expenses which shall be audited and paid by the commissioners of the said county of Waldo, who are hereby authorized to pay the same out of any funds in the treasury of said county not otherwise appropriated, or to raise the same by temporary loan.

Section 6. The governor shall on request of the county commissioners of the said county of Waldo issue a similar commission to effect the copying of so much of the records in the offices of registry of deeds of the counties of Lincoln, Kennebec and Somerset as affect the title to real estate in those portions of the

Section 7. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 199.

An Act to authorize the American Thread Company to erect and maintain piers and booms in Sebec River.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. The American Thread Company is hereby authorized and empowered to locate, erect and maintain in the Sebec river, opposite the land and shore rights of said company in the towns of Milo and Sebec in the county of Piscataquis, piers and booms for the purpose of collecting and holding logs and other lumber coming down said Sebec river that belong to said company. Said piers and booms shall be so located, constructed, maintained and used as not to impede or unreasonably obstruct the common use of said Sebec river and not to unreasonably delay logs and lumber running down said Sebec river belonging to other parties and not destined for use and manufacture at the mills of said company, its successors or assigns. Provided that -proviso. no pier shall be built within a space of fifteen feet on each side of the center line of said Sebec river.

Said American Thread Company, its successors Section 2. and assigns, by aid of such piers and booms, are hereby authorized and empowered to separate and sort out from the logs and other lumber coming down said Sebec river, all logs and other lumber destined and intended for use and manufacture at the mills of said company, and said company is also hereby authorized and empowered to hold within the piers and booms mentioned in this act and located, erected and maintained as aforesaid all logs and other lumber coming down said Sebec river which are destined and intended for use and manufacture at the mills of said company, erected upon said Sebec river.

Section 3. This act shall take effect when approved
