Chapter 210.

An Act to amend Section one of Chapter one hundred sixty-six of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred eighty-seven, entitled "An Act creating the Fort Fairfield Village Corporation," as amended by Chapter three hundred three of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and five.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred sixty-six of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred eighty-seven, as amended by chapter three hundred three of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred five, is hereby amended by striking out in the third line thereof, the word "seventy-nine," and adding instead thereof, the following: 'All of lot seventy-nine, excepting that portion thereof on the northwesterly side of the Presque Isle road, so called, and that portion thereof now owned or occupied by George H. Churchill,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The following described territory: Lots numbered two, three, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen and all of lot seventy-nine, excepting that portion thereof on the northwesterly side of the Presque Isle road, so called, and that portion thereof now owned or occupied by George H. Churchill, in the town of Fort Fairfield, according to Sawyer's survey of township Letter D, in the first range, together with the inhabitants therein, be and the same are hereby created a body politic and corporate by the name of the Fort Fairfield Village Corporation.'

Chapter 211.

An Act to incorporate the Penobscot Valley Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Charles C. Garland, H. Franklin Bailey, Clarence Scott, Ansel H. Bridges and Charles G. Davis, or such of them as may by vote accept this charter, with their associates, successors or assigns, are hereby made a body corporate and politic to be known as the Penobscot Valley Trust Company, and as such shall be possessed of all the powers, privileges and immunities and subject to all the duties and obligations, conferred on corporations by law, and especially all of the powers, privileges
