in property, or any personal property, with said corporation, and any of said courts may direct any person deriving authority from them to so deposit the same.

Section 10. Any three of the corporators named in this act may call the first meeting of the corporation by mailing a written notice, signed by all, postage paid, to each of the other corporators, seven days at least before the day of the meeting, naming the time, place and purpose of such meeting, and at such meeting the necessary officers may be chosen, by-laws adopted, and any other corporate business transacted.

Chapter 248.

An Act to incorporate the Trustees of Bridgewater Classical Academy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. A. M. Stackpole, E. C. Fulsome, J. Y. Bradstreet, A. E. Schriver, Guy C. Fletcher, Harry Hussey and A. M. Stackpole, junior, their associates and successors are duly constituted a corporation by the name of the Trustees of Bridgewater Classical Academy. They shall fill all vacancies occurring in their number, take and hold any estate, personal and real, and shall have all the powers and privileges incumbent to similar corporations.

Section 2. Any three of the persons named in section one, may call the first meeting of the trustees by notice served upon the others.
