CHAP. 265

by the Central Aroostook Electric Company and shall then be subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities to which the said Central Aroostook Electric Company shall then be subject by reason of any charter, contract or general or special law or otherwise, and shall thereupon be entitled to transmit, supply, sell and distribute electricity for light, heat and power in said Presque Isle, Mapleton, Castle Hill, township eleven, range four, and Ashland, subject, however, to the limitations of this act. In case of such sale or lease, the Maine and New Brunswick Electrical Power Company, Limited, its successors and assigns, may guarantee the stocks, bonds and coupons of the Central Aroostook Electric Company. Such sale or lease may be made in like manner and under like conditions to the Aroostook Valley Railroad Company, its successors and assigns.

guarantee of stocks, bonds, etc., in case of sale.

Certain towns authorized to contract with this company for lighting. Section 9. Whenever lawfully authorized hereunder to supply electricity in Mapleton, Castle Hill or Ashland, the municipal officers of said towns are authorized to contract with said Central Aroostook Electric Company, its successors or assigns, for a supply of electricity for municipal lighting, for a term of years, and to renew the same.

Section 10. Nothing in this act shall require any corporation organized under the general laws of the state for the sale and distribution of gas or electricity in said Mapleton, Castle Hill, township eleven, range four, or Ashland to obtain any special act of the legislature therefor.

Section II. This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 265.

An Act relating to the Bluehill Water Company,

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Certain acts in organization of Bluehill Water Co. ratified, Section 1. The organization of the Bluehill Water Company, a corporation established by chapter three hundred and fifty-three of the private and special laws of the state of Maine for the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine as now existing, based on assignments of rights under said act from the incorporators named therein, or their administrators and from the administrators of the estate of George H. Stover, who was added to the number of incorporators named in said act by chapter four hundred and ninety-nine of the private and special laws of the state of Maine for the year eighteen hundred and

ninety-seven, to Charles H. George, and assignment from said Charles H. George to Edward E. Chase, Elizabeth T. Cushman and John A. Peters by which said persons were associated jointly with said George as incorporators, is hereby ratified, validated and confirmed.

In addition to the purposes named in its said act Additional of incorporation the said Bluehill Water Company is hereby authorized to supply the inhabitants of the town of Bluehill with pure water not only for domestic, sanitary and municipal purposes, including the extinguishment of fires, but also for commercial and manufacturing purposes and the supplying of shipping.

Section 3. For the purposes of its incorporation, including the purposes hereinabove specified, the said corporation may take and hold by purchase, or otherwise, any lands or other real estate necessary for any of the aforesaid purposes and also for the protection of the water-shed of any source of supply of water, which it may take or acquire under the authority of its charter.

May take and hold lands.

Any damages for any such taking shall be determined and paid in the manner provided by section three of said act of incorporation.

Damages,

Section 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 266.

An Act to regulate ice fishing in Twitchell and Round Ponds in Greenwood, and to close the tributaries to Round and North Ponds in the county of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for any kind of fish at any time through the ice in Twitchell pond or Round pond, in the town of Greenwood, county of Oxford.

Twitchell pond, to prevent ice fishing in.

Section 2. It'shall be unlawful to fish at any time for any kind of fish in any of the tributaries to Round pond, which pond is situated in the town of Greenwood, or in the tributaries to North pond, which pond is situated in the town of Woodstock, in the county of Oxford.

Close time for fishing in tributaries of Round pond and North pond.

Section 3. Whoever violates any of the provisons of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing.

Penalty for violation of this act.
