Chapter 288.

An Act authorizing the Bodwell Water Power Company to generate, use, transmit and sell Electricity.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter eighty-one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, approved February twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred and three, entitled "An Act to authorize the Bodwell Water Power Company to generate, use, transmit and sell electricity," is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

'Section 1. The Bodwell Water Power Company is hereby specially authorized and empowered to make and generate electricity upon its property situated on the Penobscot river between the towns of Old Town and Milford and also on the dam or dams which it proposes to erect on the Stillwater branch of the Penobscot river at Gilman Falls, so called; in connection with dams erected and to be erected on the Penobscot river, and to use said electricity as a motive power in the use and development of its property, and also to sell the same for mechanical, manufacturing and heating purposes, and to sell the same for lighting purposes to any company authorized to do a general lighting business, or that may hereafter be authorized to do a general lighting business, and where power is sold to persons, firms or corporations for manufacturing purposes to sell the same to said persons, firms or corporations in connection therewith for lighting the premises owned or occupied by said persons, firms or corporations, and to sell the same to persons or firms desiring to do an electrical lighting business in the towns of Bradley and Hampden in Penobscot county, and to sell the same for motive power in the operation of any and all electric railways, and also to carry and conduct electricity made and generated upon its property between the towns of Old Town and Milford to and into any towns or cities in the county of Penobscot, state of Maine, and there to use the same in all ways for its own purposes and there to sell the same for mechanical, manufacturing, heating and said lighting purposes. But nothing herein contained shall be held to authorize said Bodwell Water Power Company to do a general lighting business. And said company is also authorized and empowered to sell and supply electricity to any street railroad company now existing or hereafter to be created.'
