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CHAP. 301**Chapter 301.**

An Act to extend the charter of the Bluehill and Bucksport Electric Railroad Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Charter  
extended.

Section 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Bluehill and Bucksport Electric Railroad Company, which were granted by chapter one hundred and fifty-seven of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, and by chapter two hundred and ninety-seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and three, are hereby extended for three years additional; and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said act.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 302.**

An Act to amend Chapter two hundred and two of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, relative to charter of the Fort Kent Telephone Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 2,

Section two of chapter two hundred and two of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five is hereby amended by inserting after the words "Fort Kent" in the third line thereof the words 'township number sixteen, range six, and township number seventeen, range five,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Addition  
to lines.

'Section 2. Said corporation is authorized to construct, maintain and operate telephone line or lines anywhere in the town of Fort Kent, township number sixteen, range six, and township number seventeen, range five, in the county of Aroostook and state of Maine, and from any point in said Fort Kent to the center of the Saint John river wherever said river bounds said town of Fort Kent, and there to connect its line or lines with the line or lines of any telephone company chartered under the laws of New Brunswick or Canada.'
