Chapter 364.

An Act to extend the charter of the Old Town Water District.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The time within which the Old Town Water District, incorporated by chapter three hundred and sixty-five of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and five may organize, is hereby extended to March first, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine, and all the rights, powers and privileges of said district which were granted by said chapter three hundred and sixty-five are hereby extended.

Charter extended.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 21, 1907.

Chapter 365.

An Act to confirm the incorporation of the Maine Children's Home Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The incorporation of the Maine Children's Home Society of Augusta, Maine, under the laws of this state is hereby ratified and confirmed, and said corporation is hereby authorized to file the certificate required by section four, chapter fifty-seven of the revised statutes, in the office of the secretary of state within sixty days of the approval of this act, with the same effect as if the same had been filed within sixty days after August fifteenth, nineteen hundred one.

Incorporation confirmed.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
