CHAP. 372**Chapter 372.**

An Act to regulate fishing in Meadow Brook, so called, and its tributaries, in the County of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Fishing in Meadow brook, to regulate.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill, at any time, in any way, any kind of fish in Meadow brook, so called, being the main inlet of Howard's pond in the town of Hanover, Oxford county; and also the tributaries of said brook, and for the purpose of this act, the outlet of said brook, above which it shall be unlawful to fish, shall be deemed to be a line drawn through a large rock, commonly known as Indian rock, in the bed of the aforesaid brook, a short distance from the point or corner of Fannie Holt's land on the easterly side of said stream, running thence at right angles with the thread of the stream directly across the same to the westerly shore of said brook.

—Limits fixed.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing.

Approved March 22, 1907.

Chapter 373.

An Act to extend the open season on Duck in Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Open season extended.

Section 1. In addition to the general law it shall be lawful to hunt, chase, catch, kill and have in possession, in accordance with the provisions of the general law, in the county of Lincoln, wood duck, commonly called black duck, teal, and any and all ducks known as gadwall or gray duck, mallard, widgeon or baldpate, shoveler, pintail or sprigtail, red-head, scaup duck or greater blue-bill, lesser scaup duck or lesser blue-bill, golden-eye or whistler, buffle-head, ruddy duck or broad-bill, from the first day of December of each year to the first day of the following February.

Section 2. The provisions of this act shall in no way change the laws now in force relating to the hunting of ducks and waterfowl on the Kennebec river and in Merrymeeting bay.

Act does not change laws in Merry-meeting bay nor in Kennebec river.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 3. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal hunting, catching, killing and having in possession of game birds.
