Chapter 393.

An Act to extend the close season on landlocked salmon and trout in Sebago Lake, in the County of Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be an annual close time for landlocked salmon and trout in Sebago lake, in the county of Cumberland, from September first of each year to April first of the following year, during which time it shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any trout or landlocked salmon in this lake, and it shall also be unlawful during this time to have in possession any trout or landlocked salmon taken from this lake. Provided, however, that it shall be lawful to fish in this lake through the ice in accordance with the provisions of the general law of the state.

Close time on landlocked salmon and trout.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing.

Penalty for violation.

Section 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

Inconsistent acts repealed.

Chapter 394.

An Act to regulate fishing in Belgrade stream, so called, in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be lawful to fish in Belgrade stream, so called, from a point two hundred feet below the bridge below Belgrade depot, so called, to Snow pond, in the town of Belgrade, county of Kennebec, in accordance with the provisions of the laws applicable to fishing in said Snow pond.

Fishing in Belgrade stream regulated.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing.

Penalty for violation.

Section 3. Provided, further, that this act shall not take effect until the commissioners of inland fish and game, without expense to the state, have caused notices to be posted in conspicuous places at or near the waters herein described setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.

Proviso.

Approved March 26, 1907.
