Chapter 395.

An Act to prohibit fishing in the brooks and streams flowing into George's River between the outlet of Quantebacook Pond in Searsmont and the dam across said George's River at North Appleton and in the tributaries to said brooks and streams.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Close time for fishing in tributaries to George's river.

It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill, at any time prior to April first, nineteen hundred and nine, any trout or landlocked salmon in any of the brooks and streams flowing into George's river, between the outlet of Quantebacook pond in Searsmont and the dam across said George's river in North Appleton, or in any of the tributaries to said brooks and streams, under the same penalty as is provided in the general laws of the state, for illegal fishing.

Section 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 396.

An Act to prohibit the sale of Trout in Washington County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sale of trout in Washington county, prohibited.

—unlawful to have more than 25 black bass in possession.

Penalty for violation.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any trout in any of the waters lying wholly or partly in the county of Washington for sale, and it shall likewise be unlawful to sell or offer for sale, directly or indirectly, any trout in said Washington county, and it shall likewise be unlawful to take, catch, kill or have in possession in any one day more than twenty-five pounds of black bass from any of the waters lying wholly or partly in the county of Washington.

Section 2. Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars and costs nor more than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and one dollar additional for every fish caught, had in possession or sold in violation of the provisions of this act.

Approved March 26, 1907.
