Section 4. It shall be the duty of the county commissioners of said county of Oxford in conjunction with the municipal officers of the town of Rumford to provide suitable court room facilities and judge's chambers for the transaction of the business of said Rumford Falls Municipal Court. Said county commissioners shall further furnish and provide such blanks, record books, stationery and supplies as may be required for the proper transaction of the civil and criminal business of said court and for use of the judge and recorder thereof in the performance of their official duties.

Section 5. All fees and emoluments heretofore accruing to the judge and recorder of said Rumford Falls Municipal Court shall hereafter enure and be payable as provided in section three to the county treasury of the county of Oxford.

Section 6. It is further provided that section fifteen of chapter eighty-one of the revised statutes of the state of Maine shall not apply to the recorder of the Rumford Falls Municipal Court, except as to such matters as may have been commenced before him when acting as judge of said court in the absence or inability of the judge.

Section 7. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 8. This act shall take effect July first, nineteen hundred and seven.

Chapter 430.

An Act for the protection of Deer in York County. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be an annual close time for deer in the county of York from December first to October thirty-first following of each year in which it shall be unlawful to hunt, chase, catch or kill any deer. It shall be unlawful to hunt, chase, catch or kill any female deer at any time in said county and no person shall catch or kill more than one buck deer in said county and it shall be unlawful to have in possession more than one buck deer which has been killed in said county.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal hunting, chasing, killing and being in possession of deer.

Section 3. All laws inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.
