**Chapter 442.**

An Act to open Brassua lake to ice fishing.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

It shall be lawful to fish in Brassua lake, in Somerset county, through the ice, as provided for ice fishing in the general law.

Fishing through ice permitted.

Approved March 28, 1907.

**Chapter 443.**

An Act to amend Section four of Chapter five hundred and eight of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five as amended by Chapter two hundred and thirty of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five and by the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, entitled, "An Act to amend Sections four and five of Chapter five hundred and eight of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five," relating to the Municipal Court of the Town of Norway and to establish a salary for the judge or said court.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section four of chapter five hundred and eight of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five as amended by chapter two hundred and thirty of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five and by the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven, is hereby further amended so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Section 4, chapter 508, private and special laws, 1885, as amended by chapter 230, private and special laws, 1895, and by special laws, 1907, further amended.

'Section 4. Said court shall be held on the first Tuesday of each month at ten o'clock in the forenoon for the transaction of civil business at such place within said town as the judge shall determine, but the town may at any time provide a court room, in which case the court shall be held therein, and all civil processes shall be made returnable accordingly, provided, however, that said court shall be held on every Tuesday at the usual hour, for the entry and trial of actions of forcible entry and detainer, and such actions shall be returnable accordingly, and be heard and determined and judgment entered on the return day of the writ unless continued for good cause, and it may be adjourned from time to time by the judge at his discretion; but it shall be in constant session for the cognizance of criminal actions; provided that if at any regular or adjourned term of said court to be held for civil business, the judge is not present at the place for holding said court within two hours after the time for
