Appropriation for.

*Resolved*, That the sum of one hundred and ten dollars be and is hereby appropriated for extra pay of Maine volunteers in the war with Spain, to be expended under the direction and supervision of the governor and council.

## Chapter 25.

Resolve in favor of Lydia A. Cummings of Rockland in the county of Knox.

Lydia A. Cummings, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the sum of four dollars per month be appropriated to Lydia A. Cummings from the date of approval of this resolve.

## Chapter 26.

Resolve in favor of repairing the road between Patten and Grand Lake.

Repairing road between Patten and Grand lake, to provide for.

*Resolved*, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of fifteen hundred dollars to aid in repairing the road leading from Patten, in Penobscot county, to Grand lake, the same to be expended upon that portion of the road which lies between Shin pond, so called, and Grand lake. The same to be expended under the direction of an agent to be appointed for that purpose by the governor and council.

## Chapter 27.

Resolve to appropriate two hundred and fifty dollars to screen Sabattus Pond, in the County of Androscoggin.

Sabattus pond, to provide for screening.

*Resolved*, That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars be and is hereby appropriated for the purpose of screening Sabattus pond or lake, so called, in the county of Androscoggin, to be expended under the direction of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game, when the balance necessary to erect said screen, as found by the commissioners, shall have been raised by the citizens of the county of Androscoggin and paid into the treasurer of state for the purpose.

Provided, further, that this appropriation shall not be available until the town of Webster shall have, in legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same.

### Chapter 28.

Resolve in favor of the Maine Insane Hospital.

*Resolved*, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of forty-three thousand two hundred sixty-five dollars and seventy-six cents, for the use of the Maine insane hospital, for the following purposes:

For the completion of the arsenal building, construction of steam line and heating, for rebuilding laundry, furnishings and machinery, for rebuilding greenhouse, for new carpenter's shop, for slaughter house, for building arsenal road and concrete sidewalk, for amount due hospital, expended at Widow's Island.

Said sums to be expended under the direction of the trustees of insane hospitals.

### Chapter 29.

Resolve in favor of William R. Marshall.

*Resolved*, That William R. Marshall of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, administrator of the estate of William C. Marshall late of Belfast in the county of Waldo, deceased, be authorized and empowered to bring and maintain a suit at common law in the supreme judicial court against the state of Maine to recover such sums as are claimed to be due said estate for the services of the said William C. Marshall as state assessor, and that such judgment if any, as may be recovered in such action, be paid from the state treasury.
