Provided, further, that this appropriation shall not be available until the town of Webster shall have, in legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same.

Chapter 28.

Resolve in favor of the Maine Insane Hospital.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of forty-three thousand two hundred sixty-five dollars and seventy-six cents, for the use of the Maine insane hospital, for the following purposes:

For the completion of the arsenal building, construction of steam line and heating, for rebuilding laundry, furnishings and machinery, for rebuilding greenhouse, for new carpenter's shop, for slaughter house, for building arsenal road and concrete sidewalk, for amount due hospital, expended at Widow's Island.

Said sums to be expended under the direction of the trustees of insane hospitals.

Chapter 29.

Resolve in favor of William R. Marshall.

Resolved, That William R. Marshall of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, administrator of the estate of William C. Marshall late of Belfast in the county of Waldo, deceased, be authorized and empowered to bring and maintain a suit at common law in the supreme judicial court against the state of Maine to recover such sums as are claimed to be due said estate for the services of the said William C. Marshall as state assessor, and that such judgment if any, as may be recovered in such action, be paid from the state treasury.
