Chapter 125.

Resolve in favor of Daniel R. Palmer of Buckfield.

Daniel R.
Palmer,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid to Daniel R. Palmer of Buckfield, in the county of Oxford, the sum of six dollars per month, payable quarterly from the fund appropriated for military pensions and beginning January first, nineteen hundred and seven, and to continue during the pleasure of the legislature.

Chapter 126.

Resolve in favor of the Norcross Transportation Company to aid in the erection of buoys as guides to navigation in North Twin Lake and adjacent thoroughfares.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars be and the same hereby is appropriated out of the money in the treasury to be paid to the Norcross Transportation Company to aid in erecting buoys as guides to navigation in North Twin lake, North Twin thoroughfare, South Twin lake, South Twin thoroughfare, Pemaduncook lake, Pemaduncook thoroughfare, and Ambegigus lake and thoroughfare. Said sum to be paid said company on the delivery to the governor and council of a certificate by one of the steamboat inspectors setting forth that said buoys have been erected at the places and in the manner approved by him.

Chapter 127.

Resolve in favor of Elmira H. Dunbar of Cherryfield.

Resolved, That there be paid to Elmira H. Dunbar of Cherryfield a pension of six dollars per month, commencing the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seven, and continuing during the pleasure of the legislature.
