Chapter 134.

Resolve in favor of Harry A. Furbish.

Resolved. That the sum of twelve hundred seven dollars and twelve cents be, and the same is hereby appropriated out of the state treasury, to be paid to Harry A. Furbish of Rangeley, in the county of Franklin, to reimburse him for damages, costs and expenses on account of a suit brought against him for cutting stumpage in Dallas plantation under a permit from the state land agent, which it afterwards appeared the said official had no authority to grant, as the state had long before parted with its title to said land.

Chapter 135.

Resolve in favor of the town of Meddybemps.

Resolved, That the sum of fifty dollars be and hereby is Town of appropriated for the purpose of reimbursing the town of bemps, Meddybemps one-half of their expenditure on state road in nineteen hundred and six.

Chapter 136.

Resolve in favor of the Town of New Portland.

Resolved, That the sum of three hundred twenty-two dollars Town of New Portbe and is hereby appropriated to be paid to the treasurer of the land, in favor of. town of New Portland for said town, the same being for moneys paid by said town for the expense of commitment and support of George Brown to the state school for boys and support of Joanna Brown and Jennie Brown committed to the Maine industrial school for girls. The said George Brown, Joanna Brown and Jennie Brown having no pauper settlement in any incorporated place in this state, but were at the time of their commitment, being cared for by the town of New Portland, at the expense of the state.
