**Chapter 145.**

Resolve in favor of the Town of Howland for the purpose of repairing bridge across the Piscataquis River.

*Resolved,* That the sum of eleven hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated for and in behalf of the town of Howland to be expended under the direction of the road commissioner of said town for the purpose of repairing the bridge across the Piscataquis river in said town.

**Chapter 146.**

Resolve in favor of the town of Trescott.

*Resolved,* That the sum of five hundred dollars be and is hereby appropriated; two hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and seven and two hundred and fifty dollars for the year nineteen hundred and eight, to the town of Trescott in maintaining its roads and bridges, said sums to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Washington county.

**Chapter 147.**

Resolve in favor of Inhabitants of Whitneyville.

That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of five hundred dollars to aid the inhabitants of Whitneyville in repairing the bridge that crosses the Machias river in said Whitneyville; which sum is to be drawn and expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Washington county.
