Resolve in favor of William J. Maxwell.

Resolved, That there be appropriated and paid to Sergeant William J. Maxwell, Company B, Second Infantry, National Guard State of Maine, the sum of one hundred dollars, for loss of time and expenses caused by illness contracted while in camp, at Camp Cobb, from August thirteenth to eighteenth, nineteen hundred and six.

Chapter 160.

Resolve in favor of improvements in Kennebec County Buildings.

Kennebec

to procure
loan for

court house.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the county of Kennebec is authorized to procure by loan, on the faith and responsibility of said county, a sum of money not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, exclusive of and in addition to loans authorized by section sixteen of chapter eighty of the revised statutes, as it has been or may be amended by the seventy-third legislature, to be expended by and under the direction of the county commissioners of said county, for the purpose of enlarging, improving and repairing the court house, providing additional vault room, or fireproof rooms, for the several county offices and for such improvements in the heating, lighting and ventilating of the county buildings as said commissioners may deem proper, and the said treasurer is hereby authorized to issue bonds of said county with interest coupons attached, to the amount of such loan; said bonds to bear interest, payable semi-annually, at a rate not exceeding four per cent per annum, the principal to be payable at such times, not later than thirty years from the date thereof, as said commissioners may fix; said bonds to be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the county commissioners of said county, and the coupons to be signed by said treasurer.
