#### Chapter 203.

Resolve in favor of the Clerk and Stenographer, and the Messenger to the Committee on Legal Affairs.

George H. Winn, in favor of. Resolved, That there be appropriated and paid to George H. Winn the sum of four hundred and fifty dollars for services as clerk and stenographer to the committee on legal affairs; and that there be appropriated and paid to E. B. Davidson the sum of seventy-five dollars for services as messenger to the same committee.

E. B. Davidson, in favor of.

#### Chapter 204.

Resolve in favor of Secretary to Committee on Public Buildings and Grounds.

George M. Barrows, in favor of. Resolved, That the sum of one hundred eleven dollars and sixty cents be paid to George M. Barrows, for expenses of stenographer at three hearings and transcribing proceedings of committee on public buildings and grounds.

#### Chapter 205.

Resolve in favor of George W. Stearns, chairman of the Committee on Education.
