Chapter 207.

Resolve in favor of Frank Fellows, messenger to the President of the Senate.

Resolved, That the sum of fifty dollars be and hereby is appropriated to be paid Frank Fellows, for services as messenger to the president of the senate.

Chapter 208.

Resolve in favor of Walter B. Clarke, chairman of the Longfellow Centennial Committee.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be paid to Walter B. Clarke, chairman, to defray expenses in connection with the observance of the centennial anniversary of the poet Longfellow's birth.

Chapter 209.

Resolve in favor of A. M. Goddard for services as counsel to Committee on Forestry Preservation and Water Supply.

Chapter 210.

Resolves providing for the appointment by the Governor of a Committee to inquire into the advisability of creating a State Board of Charities and Corrections.

Resolved, That a special committee of five be appointed by the governor to inquire into the advisability of creating a state board of charities and corrections similar to that suggested by senate document number thirty-six, nineteen hundred and seven.
