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**Chapter 225.**

Resolve in favor of J. Merrill Lord, chairman of House Committee on Elections.

*Resolved*, That the sum of five hundred eight dollars and fifty-six cents is hereby appropriated, and that the state treasurer be and is hereby authorized and directed to pay said sum to J. Merrill Lord, chairman of house committee on elections, for expenses incurred by contestees and contestants and fees of witnesses and stenographer in the election contest of representatives to the seventy-third legislature in the town of Dexter.
