Chapter 232.

Resolved, That the land agent of the state of Maine be and he is hereby authorized to convey to Lemuel H. Stover of Brunswick, Maine, the ledge or ledges in Casco bay, lying near the H. Stover. islands known as "The Gaslias," now owned by the said Stover, and which are known as "Irony Island."
