EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

"To the Honorable House of Representatives:

I have examined the House bill entitled "An Act to repeal Chapter 92 of the Laws of 1905 entitled 'An Act to provide for the better enforcement of the laws against the sale and manufacture of intoxicating liquors,'" and respectfully return the same herewith without my approval.

This bill seeks to repeal that piece of legislation commonly known as the Sturgis Law. I was nominated for and elected to the office of Governor by a political party that in its platform made the following declaration: 'Good citizenship seeks the enforcement of all law at all times; nullification never.' A repeal of the Sturgis law without substituting any similar or equally effective measure takes from the Executive all power to enforce the prohibitory law when necessary and in my judgment protects and encourages the nullification of all law.

I cannot assent to this proposition and therefore I decline to sign the bill.
