CHAP. 154

Section 2. Upon the entering of such order the clerk of courts shall expunge such name or part from the records and papers by wholly obliterating the same.

Clerk shall, when ordered, expunge from record.

Chapter 154.

An Act to amend Chapter one hundred and sixteen, Section one, of the Revised Statutes, relating to the payment of salaries of Public Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph one of section one, chapter one hundred and sixteen of the revised statutes, comprising the three lines thereof, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Paragraph 1, section 1, chapter 116, R. S., amended.

'Section 1. Unless otherwise specially provided, the following officers are entitled to receive annual salaries payable in monthly or quarterly payments, not less frequently than on the last days of March, June, September and December, as follows:'

Salaries of state officers, when payable.

Chapter 155.

An Act to amend Section six of Chapter eighty of the Revised Statutes, relating to the designation of the Clerk of County Commissioners.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section six of chapter eighty of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding the following words to said section; 'the clerk of the county commissioners shall be known as the county clerk.'

Section 6, chapter 80, R. S., amended.

Chapter 156.

An Act to prohibit certain persons from advertising as State Detectives.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person licensed as a private detective, under chapter thirty-one of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seven, to advertise or represent himself as a state detective, under penalty of the forfeiture of his license and a fine not to exceed twenty dollars, to be recovered upon complaint.

Private detective not to advertise as state detective.
