Chapter 172.

An Act to repeal a part of Section one of Chapter one hundred and sixteen of the Revised Statutes, relating to salary of officers of the Insane Hospital at Augusta.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

So much of section one, of chapter one hundred and sixteen Part of of the revised statutes as relates to the salary of the superintendent, four assistants, the steward, chaplain and matron of pealed. the Insane Hospital at Augusta is hereby repealed.

Chapter 173.

An Act to amend Chapter four, Section forty-three, of the Revised Statutes, relating to duties of Town Clerks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty-three of chapter four of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word "state" in the second line thereof the words 'and the state auditor,' so that said section shall read as amended:

Section 43, chapter amended.

'Section 43. When a town treasurer is elected and qualified, the clerk shall communicate his name to the treasurer of state and the state auditor; and no city, town or plantation shall receive any money from the treasurer of state until the name of its treasurer has been so communicated.'

Town clerk to notify treasurer of state and state audior of electown treasurer.

Chapter 174.

An Act relating to the transfer of certain Trust Funds of the Maine Industrial School for Girls to the State Treasury.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The trustees of the Maine Industrial School for Girls shall Certain pay into the state treasury the principal sums of the trust of Maine

trust funds

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school for Girls transferred to state treasury. funds now held, or which may be held by them, for the benefit of said school. Said funds shall be known by the names now attached thereto, or which may be attached by terms of gifts or bequests. The state treasurer shall semi-annually pay to the treasurer of said school a sum equal to two and one-half per cent of said amount, to be used for the benefit of said school in accordance with the several terms of gifts or bequests, or as the trustees shall from time to time determine.

Chapter 175.

An Act to facilitate the Identification of Criminals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Identification of criminals by Bertillon method.

Any officer, or the keeper of any prison, jail, lockup or other place of detention, having in custody any prisoner or person detained under suspicion, may, if deemed advisable, measure and describe, or cause such person to be measured or described, in accordance with the system, commonly known as the Bertillon method for the identification of criminals, and may cause to be taken such photographs as are deemed necessary, and may take copies of the finger prints of any such person.

Chapter 176.

An Act to repeal Section three of Chapter one hundred forty-three of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Section one of Chapter one hundred twenty of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred seven, relating to the State School for Boys.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section three of chapter one hundred forty-three of the revised statutes, as amended by section one of chapter one hundred twenty of the public laws of nineteen hundred seven, is hereby repealed.
