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mind and not insane, and a certificate signed by the secretary of the trustees of said hospital showing such transfer has been voted by the trustees, shall authorize the superintendent of the Maine School for Feeble Minded to receive and detain such patient in custody in the same manner as if he had originally been committed to such institution, and the expense of such transfer shall be paid by the state.

### Chapter 204.

An Act to increase the salary of the Commissioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Paragraph twenty of section one of chapter one hundred and sixteen of the revised statutes of nineteen hundred and three, as amended by chapter one hundred and twenty of the public laws of nineteen hundred and five, is hereby further amended, by striking out the words "fifteen hundred" in the first line, and inserting in place thereof the words 'two thousand,' so that said paragraph when amended, will read as follows:

'Commissioner of sea and shore fisheries, two thousand dollars and actual traveling expenses.'

Paragraph 20, section 1, chapter 116, R. S., as amended by chapter 120, public laws, 1905, further amended.

### Chapter 205.

An Act to increase the salary of the Warden of the Maine State Prison.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

The salary of the warden of the Maine State Prison is hereby fixed at two thousand five hundred dollars from and after the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nine, instead of the sum now provided.
