and the cost thereof, with all the necessary data for a correct understanding of their value as a forest reserve or for conserving the water powers of the state, or for reforestation, and shall further investigate the question of denuded, burnt over or barren lands in the state, their extent and value with a view to their purchase by the state for reforestation.

Section 9. The sum of five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and nine and five thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred and ten, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any fund in the treasury of the state, not otherwise appropriated, to carry out the provisions of this act.

Chapter 213.

An Act to amend Section two of Chapter one hundred and fifty-nine of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, relating to the compensation of certain State Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 2,
chapter 159,
public laws,
1905,
amended.

Section two of chapter one hundred and fifty-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and five is hereby amended by substituting for the word "twelve" in the sixth line of said section the word 'fifteen,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 2. The insurance commissioner shall receive an annual salary of eighteen hundred dollars. The governor and council may allow such reasonable sum for postage, clerk hire, and actual expenses incurred in the proper enforcement of the laws relating to insurance, as they deem proper. The deputy insurance commissioner shall receive an annual salary of fifteen hundred dollars.'

Chapter 214.

An Act to amend Section seventeen of Chapter thirty of the Revised Statutes, relating to the Sale of Poisons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventeen of chapter thirty of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word "acid" in the ninth line thereof the words 'cocaine, heroin, alpha or beta eucaine, or cannabis indica,' also by inserting after the word
