and rivers; the pollution of its waters, whereby fish may be injured, or the privileges of the citizens of the state, rightly entitled to, may be interfered with or injured, and present such information to a meeting of the association, duly called to consider it.'

Chapter 10.

An Act to extend the provisions of Chapter two hundred and forty-one of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three, entitled "An Act to supply the town of Lisbon with pure water."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Rights and powers extended for two years.

The rights, powers and privileges which were granted to the town of Lisbon by chapter two hundred and forty-one of the private and special laws of the year nineteen hundred and three, are hereby extended for and during the period of two years from the twenty-fourth day of March, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and nine, and all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted by said act may and shall be exercised in the same manner and for the same purpose as provided in said act.

Chapter 11.

An Act to extend the charter of the Fairfield and Skowhegan Railway Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Charter extended.

The rights, powers and privileges of the Fairfield and Skowhegan Railway Company, which were granted by chapter two hundred and sixty, of the private and special laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven, are hereby extended for two years from the approval of this act, and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors, shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner, and for the same purposes as specified in said act.
