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## CHAP. 70

Other corporations may hold stock.

First meeting, how called.

How act may be accepted.

Section 6. Manufactories and other business corporations doing business in said Eden are hereby authorized to subscribe and hold stock in said company.

Section 7. Any two of the corporators named in this act may call the first meeting of the corporation by mailing a written notice, signed by both, postage paid, to each of the corporators seven days at least before the day of the meeting, naming the time, place and purpose of said meeting; a president, secretary and directors may be chosen, by-laws adopted and any corporate business transacted.

Section 8. This act may be accepted at any regular meeting of said association by a majority of the members present.

### Chapter 70.

An Act to enable the town of Winter Harbor to purchase the property and franchise now or formerly of the Winter Harbor Gas and Light Company.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Town may purchase property of Winter Harbor Gas and Light Co.

Section 1. The municipal officers of the town of Winter Harbor in Hancock county when thereto directed by vote of said town, are authorized and empowered for and in behalf of said town to purchase the whole of the system of gas lighting formerly of the Winter Harbor Gas and Light Company, including any property, franchises, rights and privileges now or formerly owned by or vested in said company, or to purchase or lease any other plant or lighting system for operation in said town.

Company authorized to sell property.

Section 2. The Winter Harbor Gas and Light Company is hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey by deeds of transfer and conveyance any and all the property, franchises, rights and privileges, owned by said Winter Harbor Gas and Light Company to said town of Winter Harbor, or to such person or persons in trust for the benefit of said town as the municipal officers of said town may designate; and if the municipal officers of said town shall designate that said property, franchises, rights and privileges, shall be conveyed to any person or persons in trust, as aforesaid, they shall also designate the terms of said trust which shall be incorporated in said deed. When said conveyance is made as aforesaid, and delivered to said town, or trustee, the town shall thereupon, enter into possession and control of the property, rights, franchises and privileges therein transferred, subject to be divested

thereof upon failure to carry out the purpose and object of the creation of the Winter Harbor Gas and Light Company.

Section 3. The town of Winter Harbor is hereby authorized and empowered to raise money for the purposes of this act, and may, to carry out the provisions hereof, issue its negotiable notes, in behalf of said town, signed by the municipal officers of said town, when authorized by vote of said town.

Town authorized to raise money.

Section 4. The municipal officers of said town of Winter Harbor shall constitute a board of commissioners to perform all acts for the town consistent with this act, subject to such conditions as the town may by vote impose.

Board of commissioners, how constituted.

## Chapter 71.

An Act to authorize the Kellogg Lumber Company to erect and maintain Piers and Booms at the mouth of Moose River and in Long Pond.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. The Kellogg Lumber Company is hereby authorized and empowered to locate, erect and maintain piers, booms and sorting works at the mouth of Moose river in Long pond for the purpose of sorting out the logs and lumber of the said Kellogg Lumber Company. The said company shall sort and turn through, when logs are there, not less than twenty-five thousand sticks each day of twenty-four hours; in case of head winds and when it is not practicable to boom and turn through logs at the mouth of said Moose river in Long pond, such an amount to be sorted will not be required. All said piers, booms and works are to be located to the satisfaction of the directors of the Moose River Log Driving Company and are to be built, maintained and used at the expense of the said Kellogg Lumber Company.

Kellogg Lumber Company authorized to maintain piers and booms.

—shall sort and turn through logs.

Section 2. The said Kellogg Lumber Company is also authorized to locate, erect and maintain in Long pond all piers, booms and anchors reasonably necessary for the purpose of collecting and holding logs and other lumber coming down said pond belonging to said company and destined for use and manufacture at the mills of said company. Said piers, booms and anchors shall be so located, constructed, maintained and used as not to unreasonably obstruct the common use of said pond and not to unreasonably delay logs and lumber running down said pond belonging to other parties and not destined for use or manufacture at the mills of said Kellogg Lumber Company.

May maintain piers and booms in Long pond.

—shall not delay logs and lumber.
