## CHAP. 74

Section 2. Section two and section six of said chapter seventy-three of said private and special acts for the year nineteen hundred seven, are hereby repealed.

Sections 2 and 6, chapter 73, special laws, 1907, repealed.

Approved March 3, 1909.

### Chapter 74.

An Act to amend Chapter ninety-four of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred five entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Peaks Island Gas Company."

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section seven of chapter ninety-four of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred five entitled "An Act to incorporate the Peaks Island Gas Company" is hereby amended by striking out the word "ten" in the second line thereof and inserting the word 'fifty' in place thereof, and by adding to said section the following:

Section 7, chapter 94, special laws, 1905, amended.

'The capital stock may be divided into two classes with such designations, preferences and voting powers, restrictions and qualifications thereof as shall be fixed and determined in the by-laws or by vote of the stockholders at a meeting duly called for that purpose,' so that said section when amended shall read as follows:

'Section 7. The capital stock of said corporation shall be fifty thousand dollars and shall be divided into shares of twenty-five dollars each. The capital stock may be increased from time to time in such manner and under such restrictions as are provided for the increase of capital stock of corporations under the general law. The capital stock may be divided into two classes with such designations, preferences and voting powers, restrictions and qualifications thereof as shall be fixed and determined in the by-laws or by vote of the stockholders at a meeting duly called for that purpose.'

### Chapter 75.

An Act to regulate Fishing in Dead Stream Pond, Lower Cold Stream Pond and Horseshoe Pond, in Somerset County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

So much of section one of chapter four hundred seven of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred three, as amended, as prohibits fishing through the ice, in accordance

with the general law of the state, in Dead Stream pond, so called, and Lower Cold Stream pond and Horseshoe pond, so called, in Ten Thousand Acre township, so called, Somerset county, is hereby repealed.

**Chapter 76.**

An Act to regulate Ice Fishing in Donnell Pond, so called, situated partly in Franklin and partly in Township Number Ten, Hancock County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Fishing through ice regulated.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time through the ice in Donnell pond, so called, situated partly in Franklin and partly in township number ten, Hancock county, except on Tuesday and Friday of each week, in accordance with the general law of the state.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Court jurisdiction.

Section 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and police courts and trial justices, in their respective counties, shall have original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts.

**Chapter 77.**

An Act to regulate fishing in the tributaries to Marshall Pond, so called, in Oxford County.

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Fishing in tributaries to Marshall pond regulated.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to Marshall pond, so called, which pond is situated wholly or partly in the town of Oxford, Oxford county, except that it shall be lawful to fish in that portion of Donham brook, a tributary to said pond, which is down stream from a certain rock with staples driven therein.

Penalty for violation of this act.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for illegal fishing for trout and land-locked salmon.
