same by mortgage of its road, franchises and property, or in any other manner.

Section 9. The first meeting of the corporation may be called by any two of the incorporators, by notice in writing given or mailed to each corporator at least ten days before said meeting. Any corporator may act at such meeting by proxy.

Chapter 98.

An Act authorizing the president and secretary of the trustees of the Maine Insane and Eastern Maine Insane Hospitals to execute a deed for certain lands in Bangor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The president and secretary of the trustees of the Maine Insane and Eastern Maine Insane Hospitals are hereby authorized and empowered to execute in behalf of the state of Maine, a deed conveying to the city of Bangor a certain lot or parcel of land situated on the northerly side of State street in said city of Bangor, bounded and described as follows:

Authorized to convey certain lot of land to city of Bangor.

Beginning on the northerly line of State street at an iron bolt on the westerly line of land now owned by the Eastern Maine Insane Hospital of the state of Maine; thence north eight degrees thirty minutes east on said hospital line five hundred twenty-seven and one-half feet to a stake on the southerly line of Garland street; thence easterly on the continuation of said Garland street two hundred twenty-four and seven-tenths feet to a stake; thence southerly parallel with the dividing line between the original Treat and Drummond Farms five hundred twenty-seven and forty-five hundredths feet to a point on said northerly line of State street; two hundred and twenty-seven feet easterly of the place of beginning; thence westerly on said line of State street two hundred and twenty-seven feet to the point begun at.

Boundary.

Section 2. Said city of Bangor to pay to the treasurer of state the sum of three thousand dollars in full settlement for same.
