Chapter 101.

An Act to amend Section eleven of Chapter two hundred and eleven of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, relating to Bangor Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eleven of chapter two hundred and eleven of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

'Section 11. Said court shall be held at such place as the city of Bangor shall provide and said city shall have power and it shall be its duty to raise money and provide a proper place for said court and its officers and suitably furnish, warm and light the same, for which there shall be paid from the county of Penobscot, as rental, in quarterly payments, the sum of one thousand dollars annually. The salaries of the judge and clerk thereof, which are hereby fixed at fifteen hundred dollars and fourteen hundred and fifty dollars respectively, to be paid quarterly, with all other expenses of said court, shall be paid from the treasury of the county of Penobscot. Said clerk shall also annually receive six hundred and fifty dollars for clerk hire, or so much thereof as may be necessary, payable in the same manner and from the same source as his salary.'

Chapter 103.

An Act to extend the charter of the Fairfield Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The rights, powers and privileges of the Fairfield Trust Company which were granted by chapter ninety of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven, are hereby extended for one year; and all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted by said chapter ninety of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seven, may

and shall be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as provided therein; provided, however, that said company shall actually commence business as a trust company within said one year.

Chapter 104.

An Act to extend the charter of the Peaks Island Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Charter ex-
tended.

The charter of the Peaks Island Railroad Company is hereby extended for a period of two years from and after the date of the approval of this act.

Chapter 105.

An Act to revive and extend the charter of the Skowhegan Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Charter re-
vived and
extended.

The rights, powers and privileges of the Skowhegan Trust Company, which were granted by chapter four hundred and seventy-eight of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and one, are hereby revived and extended for one year; and the persons named in said act, their associates and successors shall have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted them by said act, to be exercised in the same manner and for the same purposes as specified in said act; provided, however, that said company shall actually commence business as a trust company within said one year.

An Act to extend the charter of the Camden and Augusta Railway.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

The rights, powers and privileges of the Camden and Augusta Railway which were granted by chapter seventy-five of the private and special laws of one thousand nine hundred and three, as amended by chapter three hundred and forty-three of the private and special laws of one thousand nine hundred and seven, are hereby extended for two years from
