Chapter 125.

An Act to regulate Fishing in the waters in Alder Stream Township, in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Secion I. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch or kill more than ten trout in all in any one day in any of the waters in Alder stream township, in the county of Franklin.

Number of fish to be taken in one day.

Section 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this Penalty for violation of act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law of the state for the illegal fishing for and catching trout and land-locked salmon.

Section 3. In all prosecutions under this chapter, municipal and police courts and trial justices, within their respective counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior courts.

Chapter 126.

An Act entitled, "An Act to amend the Charter of the New England Retail Grocers' Publishing Company."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Whereas, the New England Retail Grocers' Publishing Com- Statement. pany was organized under the general laws of the state of Maine on the twenty-fourth day of October, eighteen hundred and ninety, with the following purposes, to wit:

"The purposes of said corporation are printing and publishing a paper called the New England Grocer, and for the purpose of doing any other business necessary to promote the circulation and profits of said paper."

And whereas, said original purposes are insufficient and unsuitable for the extended and growing business of said company, and amendment thereof is necessary for the business purposes of the company. Now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. That the purposes of said New England Retail Purposes. Grocers' Publishing Company, a corporation organized under the general laws of the state of Maine, are the printing and publishing of a paper called the New England Grocer, or under such other name as said company may adopt for said publication, and for the purpose of carrying on any other business necessary to promote the circulation of said periodical.
